The world celebrated Environment Day on June 5. The day reminds us about the importance of environmental conservation and encourages us to take proactive measures to lead eco-friendly lives.

At Utkarsh, every day is Environment Day. We walk the talk. Our offices practice environmental protection in our daily routines.

The Utkarsh Environmental Protection Movement, for the last 10 years, has been at the forefront in its battle against plastic pollution and to protect and conserve nature at every step of the way. Utkarsh organizes various campaigns that not only aim to spread awareness about plastic pollution but also lend a helping hand to people to follow practices to help nature and reduce pollution. The Movement also organises various other campaigns to ensure the overall protection of our planet.

Let us take a look at our campaigns that have impacted thousands of people, young and old, in the past few years.

SAY NO TO SINGLE-USE PLASTIC

Active in five states, the campaign focuses on mass education and community involvement, along with government collaboration, to encourage people to reduce plastic consumption.

We are aware of plastic pollution but how many of us are ready to give up the convenience plastic offers? This reluctance is what is killing our planet, inch by inch, day by day. Plastic pollution is harming our air, soil, and water, while also entering the food chain. That means plastic is now present in your food!

How did so much plastic end up around us? WE are to blame!

THE EXTENT OF PLASTIC POLLUTION

The Plastic Overshoot Day Report (released on April 11, 2024) finds that a whopping 220 million tonnes of plastic waste will be generated in 2024 worldwide. The study also finds that there are just 12 countries responsible for 60% of the world's plastic waste. We are not shocked to see that India is among the top five!

The most widely used plastic items are single-use plastics, or the items used for just about two or three minutes and then discarded. Plastic carry bags, cutlery, straws, cups, packaging materials, wrappers, etc., are some of the single-use plastics that the world uses and throws away in just a few seconds. These plastics end up in landfills, oceans, and soil and remain there for hundreds of years. Only 9 percent of plastic is recycled. Plastic is non-biodegradable which means it does not disintegrate but remains as it is for years before it is broken down into microplastics. They continue to emit toxic gases that enter the air, water, and soil and harm the environment as long as they exist, and that is forever.

Let us take a look at plastic bags. In addition to being a major cause of plastic pollution, these bags are also killing lakhs of marine animals every year. Studies state that by 2050, there will be more plastic than fish in the sea. Birds mistake plastic bags for food and consume them, filling their stomachs with the toxic material. Poor sea turtles assume plastic bags are jellyfish and end up eating the plastic.

The damage is done, but if we try, we can at least ensure no plastic is added to the mountains of plastic waste that are drowning the planet.

UTKARSH APPEALS "SAY NO TO SINGLE-USE PLASTIC"

The campaign focuses on education and solutions, as we organise awareness campaigns in educational institutions, commercial establishments, and public places, motivating people to switch to eco-friendly alternatives to plastic items. Utkarsh also distributes cloth bags and steel water bottles to discourage the use of plastic carry bags and plastic bottles.

In an attempt to ensure the easy availability of cloth bags, Utkarsh also installs cloth bag vending machines in markets and other public places.

People around the globe buy 1 million plastic water bottles every minute, studies find. Only about 9% of it is recycled. The rest are still lying around. Only if people had carried a water bottle with them instead of buying water in plastic bottles!

TREE PLANTATION DRIVES

Trees are the magic that we urgently need today. They keep the air clean as they absorb toxic pollutants and release oxygen into the air, making the air cleaner. In cities, trees act as a 'super cleaner' of the air, as they absorb pollutant gases like carbon monoxide, ozone, and nitrogen oxides and even sweep up dust and smoke. Considering urban environments fill the air with pollutants every minute, trees can reduce air pollution considerably.

Trees also reduce the risk of natural disasters such as landslides and floods, as they play a key role in capturing rainwater, with their roots acting like filters.

Sadly, we are cutting trees instead of planting them. Deforestation has reduced India's green cover considerably, leading to desertification and drought in many areas. There is only one solution: more trees!

Utkarsh is committed to environmental protection and organises tree plantation drives regularly in five states.

We have planted more than 10,000 trees to date.

Utkarsh is also all set to launch **Utkarsh Green Project 2024**, with the target of 2024 tree plantations this year.





WASTE MANAGEMENT

Collaboration with

Campaign – "My Waste, My Responsibility"

It comprises:

Awareness Campaigns on Dry and Wet Waste

Working with rag pickers and raddiwalas for waste collection

Training in converting wet waste into manure or compost

Collection of electrical waste

Training in implementing 'Zero Waste' in schools and homes

"Know Your Air" Campaign in Schools and Households

Aim – To raise awareness about fine particulate matter (PM10) dust and Nitrogen Dioxide (NO₂) gas, pollutants that are highly toxic and damaging. NO₂ gas is formed when Nitrogen Dioxide (NO_{χ}) released from exhaust pipes mixes with the air.

These pollutants come from vehicle exhaust pipes and are regarded as the biggest sources of air pollution. Diesel vehicles are the most polluting.

"Know Your Air" Campaign will include:

- · Measuring AQI of the area and showing ways to improve air quality
- Awareness campaigns to encourage people to walk or cycle more and drive less as and when possible
 - To switch off engines when stationary
 - To switch to car-sharing
 - To check tyre pressures
- Awareness on the importance of low emission vehicles petrol vehicles are less polluting than diesel and hybrid vehicles
- Awareness campaigns in villages about the harmful effects of stubble burning and finding ways to recycle and reuse farm residue for a healthier environment

CLEAN WATER

Utkarsh undertakes cleaning of rivers, lakes and other polluted water resources, removing plastic and other pollutants from the rivers. We also check the water pollution of rivers and lakes via water checking labs.

Conducting awareness campaigns in factories and business areas to prevent water drainage system connecting to precious water resources and encouraging them to set up waste water management systems is also a part of the "Clean Water" campaign. We also organised cleaning drives for water tanks in government schools every month, to ensure young children get access to clean drinking water.





SAVE WATER CAMPAIGN

Campaign - Fix a Leak Today, Save Water for Tomorrow



Surveys find that:

A leaking tap wastes around 15 litres of water a day.

A dripping tap can waste around **20,000 litres** of water a year.

We visit households and offices and fix leaking taps and valves. We also spread awareness about illegal water borewells, eating into groundwater resource.

HEALTHY SOIL

Awareness campaigns for farmers about organic farming and the harmful effects of pesticides and insecticides on soil and to the health of the farmers. Workshops on saving soil fertility and ways to make soil healthier.

Why Organic Farming?

Studies and surveys around the world have found that "organic nutrition is good for sustaining soil fertility and quality of produce. Organic methods such as using eco-friendly and natural pesticides instead of hazardous pesticides also ensures soil health. Soil organic matter is the major active reservoir of carbon, which prevents build-up of CO₂ concentration in the atmosphere."

Utkarsh conducts the ABC programme in Mumbai, Ambernath, Latur and Nashik.

ABC (Sterilisation & Vaccination) is crucial in dog population management.

Utkarsh ABC is unique. Apart from following the AWBI (Animal Welfare Board of India) guidelines, Utkarsh also undertakes the following procedures:

- Videography of the catching and releasing process to note and ensure the exact location
- 7-in-1 vaccination to the dogs at the time of admissions to prevent viral infections
- Complete blood examination of the dogs before surgery
- Tying reflective radium collars to the dogs on their release to protect them from road accidents at night

UTKARSH DAILY FEEDING DRIVE FOR STRAYS

Utkarsh undertakes feeding drive for stray animals in Mumbai and feeds more than 6000 animals daily. Strays are neglected animals and are forced to roam in search of food, often ending up in garbage bins. Hungry animals, especially dogs, can turn aggressive. When strays are well-fed, they do not roam but take rest. They are calm and peaceful when their stomachs are full. Utkarsh Daily Feeding Drives have helped reduce human-animal conflict in the regions.

They carry palkhis or palanquins carrying padukas (sandals) of Sant Dyaneshwar and Tukaram till Pandharpur, the abode of Lord Vithoba, with stops at prominent religious places on the way.
