NATURE CONSERVATION FOR A BETTER WORLD FOR EVERYONE

Most of us seem to forget that we are dependent on nature. Indiscriminate use of plastics, an increase in concrete jungles, deforestation, and other human actions are harming the environment in umpteen ways, so much so that scientists are sounding alarm bells.

We need to remember that nature will survive without us—maybe even flourish—but humans will not be able to survive without a vibrant nature. Thus, it is high time for each of us to contribute to nature conservation.

UNDERSTANDING NATURE CONSERVATION

July 28 was World Nature Conservation Day. It is celebrated worldwide to spread awareness about the urgency of protecting nature.

Nature conservation is the protection of the environment and natural resources, which include air, water, soil, minerals, plants, and wildlife.

NATURE CONSERVATION IS CRUCIAL

Human survival depends on an active ecosystem, or a community of living things. Even if a single component of the ecosystem suffers damage, it affects the balance of the entire ecosystem.

Experts also point out that nature conservation efforts not only enhance the health of the planet and its species but also contribute to the economy by supporting the livelihoods of people that depend on nature for their survival.

Let us take a look at the three main factors in nature conservation.

LOSS OF BIODIVERSITY

Biodiversity refers to the variety of life on earth. There are different species, a variety of animals, different types of plants, and even microorganisms and fungi that

constitute nature! Each of them plays an important role in maintaining the balance of the ecosystem. It is through biodiversity that we are able to survive, as it provides clean water, food, shelter, and medicines.

The increasing human population, coupled with our irresponsible lifestyle, is contributing to the loss of natural resources, leading to a loss of habitat for several species.

While climate change and overexploitation of natural affect biodiversity adversely, resources destruction and pollution are also equal offenders.

The diverse species of animals and plants are essential for human existence because they are responsible for soil retention, preventing soil erosion, oxygen production, and even ensuring flood protection.

If urgent actions are not taken, more plant and animal species will face extinction, and by 2050, every sixth animal species will disappear from the earth.

With the loss of even a single animal, bird, bee, or microorganism, the whole ecosystem faces imbalances because of changes in the food chain. Loss of species also affects weather, soil fertility, carbon absorption, and causes floods and storms, while adversely affecting air, soil, and water quality.

THE SURVIVAL OF HUMANS

Human actions have already damaged the environment. It is not irreversible, but it is high time we protect what is remaining.

Climate change and the loss of biodiversity are threatening human survival. The temperature patterns are changing. Global warming is affecting us in multiple ways, threatening crop collapse, causing the disappearance of lakhs of species, and also making communities inhabitable. Wildfires and storms are becoming more common. Because of widespread shifts in weather systems, droughts, floods, and hurricanes have become unpredictable.

Studies predict that in the next two or three decades, people will suffer adverse climate changes. Millions of people will face displacement because of annual floods. Because of regular natural disasters such as floods, droughts, and storms, there will be crop losses, leading to a food shortage. It is not just about it. Experts also caution against global pandemics becoming a regular phenomenon.

Of course, adding to all these disasters will be increasing air, water, and soil pollution.

Now do you see why nature conservation is a necessity and not something we can afford to ignore?



PROTECTION OF HERITAGE

Nature and its resources are a part of our heritage. When we protect nature as heritage, we allow the environment to bloom and to be enjoyed. It also shows us how old ways of nature conservation are still relevant and worth practising.

In ancient times, people protected and conserved nature, and lived in harmony with it. Even in India, people followed eco-friendly lives, protecting plant and animal species. Practices such as maintaining sacred groves and the worship of rivers, mountains, and certain plants and trees were, in many ways, protecting nature. Indigenous people often lived in harmony with nature and used ancient knowledge of medicine and food for their survival.

Today, these ancient methods are ignored. It is time to go back and learn about sustainable living.

HOW CAN YOU CONTRIBUTE TO NATURE CONSERVATION?

Let us reduce our ecological footprint, which means putting less demand on nature and its resources.

Follow the **3** R's: Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle.

Reduce the use of plastic, especially single-use plastics

Try to reduce the use of at least one plastic item every day. Carry a cloth bag to markets, and do not accept plastic carry bags from the vegetable vendors. Do not ask for plastic or even paper straws. Carry a steel straw with you. Instead of buying water bottles, carry a reusable water bottle. Switch to eco-friendly items. It will be a huge help to the planet and to future generations. Plastic pollution is killing us and polluting precious natural resources. Act now!

AVOID LITTERING

First, try not to use any one-use items. Put discarded items in a dustbin. Try to reuse as much as possible. Organise clean up drives in your locality or participate in Utkarsh cleaning drives.

DONATE, DON'T THROW AWAY

Donate your old clothes, electronic items, newspapers, and other items to a local NGO or any charity. The more you reuse, the lesser will be the impact on the environment.

Every year, more than 10 lakh devotees undertake the Pandharpur Wari, or the walk of worship, from different places to the Pandharpur Temple. Pandharpur Wari honours Lord Vitthal. Around 800 years old, the Wari is an important part of Maharashtra's cultural heritage.

Wari means a periodical pilgrimage, and Warkari means "one who performs the wari." Devotees carry the paduka, or the footprints of Sant Dnyaneshwar and Sant Tukaram, in a palkhi. The pilgrimage commences at the Alandi and Dehu Sansthan and culminates at the Pandharpur Temple. The Warkaris undertake the 21-day yatra on foot.

It is a sight to behold and a beautiful spiritual experience as the Warkaris sing and dance their way to meet Lord Vithoba. Children, men, women, and senior citizens participate in the event with the utmost devotion.

Utkarsh joined the Pandharpur Wari with our "Say No to Single-Use Plastic" campaign, which we named "Utkarsh Environment Wari!" Our slogan was "Single-Use-Plastic-Free Pandharpur Yatra!"

Plastic bags and plastic water bottles have become a part of our daily existence, because of the convenience they offer. These single-use plastic items either reach landfills, rivers or lie scattered around, causing plastic pollution, affecting the quality of water, air, and soil, and, of course, the health of humans and animals.

With our humble initiative, we ensured that the Pandharpur Yatra, from Dehu to Pandharpur, was free of single-use plastics!

The campaign to make Pandharpur Wari 2024 free from single-use plastics was a huge success, as we received a heartwarming response from the warkaris.

Utkarsh Environment Wari 2024 was launched on June 29, 2024 at Dehu, with the distribution of 50,000 cloth bags and 50,000 steel water bottles to the warkaris.

Utkarsh was present on all the main stops of Pandharpur Wari, including Alandhi Sansthan, Saswad, Baramati, Faltan, and Indapur, from June 29 to July 17. On the final day, as the Warkaris celebrated Ashadhi Ekadashi at Pandharpur on July 17, Utkarsh also joined in the spiritual fervour. The Utkarsh team, including Adv. D. R. Londhe, President, Utkarsh, along with trustees and other team members, was present in Pandharpur distributing cloth bags and steel water bottles.

Utkarsh distributed 5 lakh cloth bags and 2.5 lakh steel water bottles to the Warkaris from Dehu to Pandharpur.





#StrayTogether will be soon held at the MCGM Centre for Municipal Capacity Building and Research (MCMCR), Powai, Mumbai. The Utkarsh team, comprising Adv. D. R. Londhe, CEO; Shri Pravin Jadhav, General Secretary and Chief PRO; and Ms. Harsha Darpe, Centre Manager, Utkarsh Animal Hospital, Mumbai, met with Dr. Yogesh Wankhede, SR. Veterinary Officer, MCMGM, and Shri Chandrashekhar Karekar, Admin, MCMCR, and local feeders, to this effect on July 13, 2024. As a part of the initiative, Utkarsh will carry out ABC (sterilization and vaccination), feeding and medical care for dogs, and other services in the complex and the surrounding areas.

#StrayTogether is a unique and one-of-its-kind campaign from Utkarsh that aims to resolve human-animal conflicts through the scientific management of strays

Aimed at spreading awareness about strays and to encourage and facilitate human-animal peaceful cohabitation, '#StrayTogether' is held at housing societies and constitutes the following activities:

Sterilisation and vaccination of animals in and around the area

Ensuring feeding, medical treatment, and care with the help of Utkarsh

Dog handling is a crucial part of dog catching for ABC. The right techniques and process ensures smooth functioning and minimal risk to the dogs and catchers.

Utkarsh conducts the ABC programme in Mumbai, Ambernath, Latur and Nashik.

ABC (Sterilisation & Vaccination) is crucial in dog population management.

Utkarsh ABC is unique. Apart from following the AWBI (Animal Welfare Board of India) guidelines, Utkarsh also undertakes the following procedures:

- Videography of the catching and releasing process to note and ensure the exact location
- 7-in-1 vaccination to the dogs at the time of admissions to prevent viral infections
- Complete blood examination of the dogs before surgery
- · Tying reflective radium collars to the dogs on their release to protect them from road accidents at night

UTKARSH DAILY FEEDING DRIVE FOR STRAYS

Utkarsh undertakes feeding drive for stray animals in Mumbai and feeds more than 6000 animals daily. Strays are neglected animals and are forced to roam in search of food, often ending up in garbage bins. Hungry animals, especially dogs, can turn aggressive. When strays are well-fed, they do not roam but take rest. They are calm and peaceful when their stomachs are full. Utkarsh Daily Feeding Drives have helped reduce human-animal conflict in the regions.
